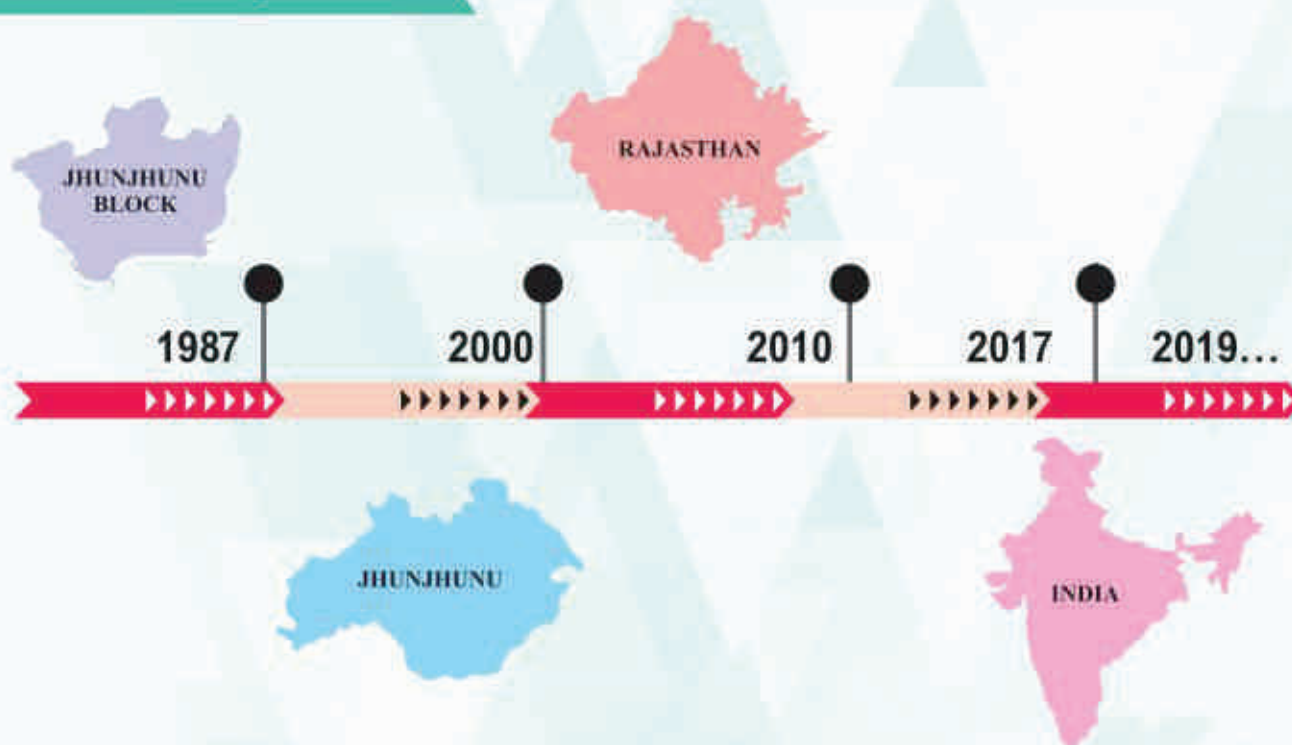

PROGRAM OVERVIEW :

SAFER CITIES

Ensuring safe public space for Women and Girls :

The project started in July 2018, Under the program, organization SRKPS has intervened in two wards i.e. Ward Number 22 and 27 of Hasanpura Basti in Jaipur City. The Safer Cities for Girls is a locally led, globally united initiative of Plan International that contributes to develop safe, accountable, and inclusive cities with and for girls. The project is a critical pivot to achieve a step-change improvement in safety for girls in cities and promoting gender equality. It is playing a decisive role in delivering transformative change in the lives of girls.

“The project has engaged with a range of stakeholders like girls, boys, parents and caregivers and local authorities (e.g., municipal authorities, public transport managers, police etc.) to confront social and cultural norms and unequal gender power relations which hinder girls’ safety in cities. The program has created a core group of girls and boys who continue to participate in the program activities on a regular basis. The major highlights of the year are establishment of two YRCs, 500 children and youth are regularly visiting centres, engagements with government, non-governmental organizations and community based organizations for girl’s safety, safety walks and mapping, score card and development of public spaces. The young girls as well boys and other community members have actively participated in all the activities.”

Activities :

- Mobilize girls and boys into clubs and building their capacities for action using Champions of Change Curriculum.
- Conduct girls led safety audits of the locality and develop the community scorecard to be using during interface meeting with duty bearers jointly developed solution.
- Intergenerational dialogue between girls, family and community members.
- Organize city/public School - wide communication on safety in public spaces capacity building of volunteers on role and responsibilities, reporting mechanism, follow-up action and monitoring framework.
- Identify, develop, reclaim / transform and facilitate the management and maintenance of community managed spaces.
- Collaborative engagements with government, non governmental organisations and community based organisation for girls safety.
- Conduct training / orientation and interface meeting with transformation staff and authority in the informal and formal system using the transportation curriculum.

LET GIRL BE BORN (LGBB)

Eliminating Gender bias sex selection

Sex ratio is used to describe the number of females per 1000 of males. Sex ratio is a valuable source for finding the population of women in India and what is the ratio of women to that of men in India. In the Population Census of 2011 it was revealed that the population ratio in India 2011 is 940 females per 1000 of males.

The major cause of the decrease of the female birth ratio in India is considered to be the violent treatment meted out to the girl child at the time of the birth. The sex ratio in India was almost normal during the phase of the year of Independence, but thereafter it started showing gradual sign of decrease. Though the sex ratio in India has gone through commendable sign of improvement in the past 10 years, there are still some States where the sex ratio is still low.

As a response to this issue, Plan India has launched the (LGBB) **“Let Girls Be Born campaign”** and its main objective is **“to realize a gender balance in society by eliminating female feticide/infanticide and ensuring the right to identity, name and citizenship for girls”**. In the same context SRKPS is an implementing partner NGO of PLAN india's direct implementing the LGBB campaign.

We recognize that communities, families and children themselves are an integral part of any effective child protection system. As such, we focus on bringing stakeholders together to collaborate in building a long-term protective environment for children in their communities.

CHILDLINE 1098, Jhunjhunu was started in September, 2016 and within a few months it reached to every town and village of the district. To raise awareness among children and masses about the helpline community events, open school events, etc were organized. In launching of the helpline in district great support from District Administration, Child Welfare Committee and Police department was received.

TARGETED INTERVENTION (KOTA)

It is evident that in India, over 90% of HIV transmission happens through unprotected sex or through the sharing of infected injecting equipments. Much of the transmission occurs with high risk groups like Female Sex Workers, Men Having Sex with Men and Intra Venus Drug Users and HIV prevention will only be successful when we curtail HIV transmission among these groups with effective targeted intervention. Well designed target intervention with bridge population like truckers and migrants helps in averting HIV/AIDS among general population.

Activities

- Increasing the utilization of risk reduction services by IDUs in Kota and the Suburbs.
- Brining Behavioral Change by switching from Needle use/sharing to safer injecting practices and linking with OST centres for deaddiction.
- Reducing the transmission of HIV/AIDS among the IDU community by elimination of multiple use of syringe. Along with distribution of onetime use syringe.
- Reducing the transmission of HIV/AIDS from IDUs to partners, offspring's and wider community by sanitizing IDUs and families about safe sex and providing condoms.
- To create an enabling environment people already suffering from AIDS by regular treatment at ART centres. Along with regular counselling session with family members.

Achievements:

1. Started working with the families of IDUs in financial year 18-19:
 - i. By providing TI services like- counseling, clinical services, risk management strategies, ICTC, commodities- condoms etc to their wives to further reduce the risk.
 - ii. By forming SHGs groups within the community where IDUs reside and linking their wives with these SHGs to provide linkage with financial services and helping them grow.
2. Continuously working in community of HRGs to promote behavioural change of IDUs through regular hotspot meeting, DIC meetings and improved outreach with families of IDUs through female outreach worker and counselor.
3. Regular liaising and coordination with different stakeholders at each level for effective sharing of data and information.

SAKSHAM

Saksham is an initiative to support disadvantaged youth, especially young women in India, to enable them to realise their dreams by equipping them with essential life and market-oriented vocational skills. This not only helps them to access decent employment but also makes them representatives of a gender just society and gives them the independence to be themselves.

As well as promoting job-oriented, vocational and entrepreneurship training, the project helps to teach parents, communities and employers about gender equality, equal opportunities and economic empowerment for girls as gender equality is embedded in all the courses. This environment is designed to encourage young girls to take up training and employment opportunities to build a trained female workforce. Local businesses have engaged with the project to promote women-friendly work environments.

The idea of launching the Saksham project at Jaipur was thus conceived to up skill and provide meaningful employment to the youth living in the area of Jhotwara, Khatipura, Govindpura, Murlipura and Shastri Nagar. These areas were chosen as they are populated by low-income households with high population density.

Model School:

Empowering children through Model School project was started with support from Abercrombie and Kent from July 2018 and continue till June 2019. The project is being implemented in Government Primary School of Kacherwala in Chokhliyavaas village of Amber tehsil in Jaipur District. In this particular primary school there 23 girls and 14 boys (a total of 37) students in 1st to 5th standard.

Under this project reconstruction of boundary wall, repairing Roof and of main building and upgrade the existing toilets for girls and boys separately has done. Also construction of Veranda, Flag stand, Iron board at Main Gate and Hand Washing Unit (Under BALA Work: Selection of murals and painting has done).

State Level Advocacy for Various Acts:

- The PC&PNDT Act, 1994 – SRKPS from the last 20 years working in State of Rajasthan with different stakeholders such as government bodies, elected representatives, NGOs/CBOs, Multi and Bi-lateral Agencies for effective implementation of the PC&PNDT Act, 1994 in the state. With the collaborative efforts of State Government, NGOs and various agencies Rajasthan's SRB has recorded an increase from 2005 to 2018.
- The COTPA, 2003 – SRKPS started raising the issue of harmful effect of Tobacco use in 2005 and started working with administration for effective implementation of COTPA 2003 result of the collaborative effort of SRKPS and District Administration Jhunjhunu was declared first smoke free district of Rajasthan. Followed by campaign to make Rajasthan a smoke free state. Currently in technical and financial support from The Union, New Delhi, SRKPS is playing a prominent role in implementing of the COTPA, 2003 and promoting evidence based best practices prescribed under tobacco control worldwide.
- The MTP Act, 1971 – SRKPS with Pratigya Campaign for Gender Equality and Safe Abortion, currently hosting by FRHS India has been actively involved in advocating with governments and other stakeholders on safeguarding women's right to safe abortion in State of Rajasthan.
- The Mental Healthcare Act, 2017 – SRKPS is actively playing an important role in effective implementation of the Mental Healthcare Act, 2017 and promoting the National Mental Health Policy, 2014 with governments and other stakeholders in the State of Rajasthan.
