Mission

Women, Children & Deprived class should be organized and make them able to take active participation in Health, Education and self-governance to eliminate inequalities.

Organizational Approach

The main objectives of the organization are to improve the social, institutional and property base for the people who often remain unheard or ignored in a democratic and participatory approach of our country. To sustain this work community based organizations (CBOs) at the village level are linked with local, block and district level administration and PRIs so that these CBOs can take over the development programmes and reduce the dependency of people on others.

Operational Area

The main objectives of the organization are to improve the social, institutional and property base for the people who often remain unheard or ignored in a democratic and participatory approach of our country. To sustain this work community based organizations (CBOs) at the village level are linked with local, block and district level administration and PRIs so that these CBOs can take over the development programmes and reduce the dependency of people on others.



SRKPS works extensively in entire Rajasthan on the issue of human rights, whereas intensively it is intervening in twelve districts of Rajasthan i.e. Jhunjhunu, Jaipur, Sikar, Churu, Hanumangarh, Sri Ganganagar, Kota, Bikaner, Bharatpur, Jaisalmer, Jodhpur and Udaipur, with its headquarter being at Jhunjhunu and branch offices at the other districts.



Creating an enabling environment for girls:

Gender discrimination has huge impact on girls and young women's health. Sex determination and sex selective abortion of female fetus is one of the worst forms of gender discrimination violating the survival of rights of child.

LET GIRLS BE BORN

The LGBB project is being run by SRKPS with the technical and financial support of Plan India, New Delhi. The project started from 1st March 2011. Since both the rural and urban population was to be targeted, 20 gram Panchayats of Chakshu Panchayat Samiti of Jaipur district and 20 wards of Jaipur Municipal Corporation were selected for intervention.

The project focuses on to realize a gender balance in society by eliminating female feticide/infanticide and ensuring the right to identity, name and citizenship through birth registration. Under this project, the activities being carried out till date are organizing meetings with different stakeholders (ASHA, AWW, PRI, VHSC members and community) in each of the selected intervention areas (Gram Panchayats and wards), sensitization cum training programs for SHG members, youth members, media conference on the issue of female feticide and status of sex ratio in Rajasthan as per the census 2011. The LGBB project is not only enhancing on the issue of female feticide but also implementing the PCPNDT Act strongly on the working areas. It has been the great achievement by now that LGBB has strengthened the women status and also protecting from declining of child sex ratio.

Four sting operations in collaboration with District Administration Jaipur and one sting operation in collaboration with State PCPNDT cell has been conducted in Jaipur where 6 doctors, 6 compounders and 1 agent were caught red handed conducting & revealing sex determination.

A State Level One Day Workshop on 'Challenges of Implementation of PCPNDT (Pre Conception and Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques {Misuse of technology}), MTP (Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act) and the Population Policy' was to bring concerned stakeholders at one platform to discuss as how the two acts can be implemented effectively considering the strengths and weaknesses of the population policy in the context of the challenges associated with sex determination and safe abortions.

Zonal level orientation workshop were conducted where collectors, ADMs, SDMs, CMHOs, Public prosecutors and PCPNDT coordinator form 9 districts of Jaipur and Bharatpur Division participated from Jaipur and Bharatpur were conducted where divisions. As a result of the workshop the appropriate authorities have regulated their inspection visit and have taken all necessary steps for strong monitoring on the Act.



Media group has been sensitized and are taking every opportunity to highlight the issue; we are getting their support in the form of coverage and space of sensitive issues. ETV Rajasthan in collaboration with SRKPS has taken a initiative of involving transgender in the celebration activity of birth of girl child at community level.

Advocacy & Support groups have been formed in Gram Panchayat and Wards with an overall objective of creating village based monitoring and supporting mechanism which can do advocacy on rights of girl child with members from Local Self Governments/Self Help Groups/ASHA (accredited Social Health Activist)/Auxiliary Nursing Midwife/Religious Leaders, youth and other community representatives as well as can provide advice, orientation and immediate help in case of forced abortion to adolescents and newly married women

Rath Yatra Program was organized on FY 12-13 which was **inaugurated & flagged off was by Honorable chief minister of Rajasthan Shree Ashok Gehlot Ji** on the occasion of National Girl Child day. This Rath visited 20 wards of Jaipur and Chaksu Panchayat Samiti. The overall aim of the rath Yatra was to sensitize the community through creating awareness on, ill effects of the SD and SSA, features of the PCPNDT act and child rights for their rights and encouraging them to demand for their rights It was a great achievement of us as we covered the important areas on the route, showed folk media program at several schools, colleges, government office, gram Panchayats and public gathering places. At every place people welcomed the Rath and showed their keen interest in knowing the messages and discussion on the issues of the Child rights. Key person and elderly including (PRIs, Officials etc) flagged off the Rath for next destination.

Apart from these in 2012-13 18 decoy operations has been conducted in Jaipur in which 5 sonography centres were caught red handed.

SABLA

Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls (RGSEAG) - Sabla

The SABLA project is implemented by SRKPS with the support of women & child development department, Jaipur Rajasthan. The project is implemented in the 10 Districts of Rajasthan and SRKPS is implementing this project in 174 AWCs form 5 sectors of Sanganer city of Jaipur district. This SABLA scheme aims at empowering Adolescent Girls (AG) of 11-18 years by improving their nutritional and health status, up gradation of home skills, life skills and vocational skills. The girls will be equipped with information on health and family welfare, hygiene and guidance on existing public services.

The objectives of the scheme are to:

1. Enable self-development and empowerment of AGs;
2. Improve their nutrition and health status;



3. Spread awareness among them about health, hygiene, nutrition, Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH), and family and child care;
4. Upgrade their home-based skills, life skills and vocational skills;
5. Mainstream out-of-school AGs into formal/non formal-education; and
6. Inform and guide them about existing public services, such as PHC, CHC, Post Office, Bank, Police Station, etc

The scheme focuses on all out-of-school AGs, who would assemble at the Aaganwadi Centre (AWC) as per timetable and frequency to be decided by the State Governments /UTs concerned. The others, i.e. school-going girls, would meet at the AWC at least twice a month, and more frequently (once a week) during vacations/holidays. Here they will receive life skills education, nutrition and health education, awareness about socio-legal issues, etc. This will provide an opportunity for mixed group interaction between school-going and out-of-school girls, motivating the latter to also join school and help the school going to receive the life skills.

- **TOBBACO CONTROL PROJECT**

SRKPS along with the support of District Administration, Jhunjhunu and Jaipur is working towards building a healthy environment in Jhunjhunu and Jaipur district of Rajasthan, through controlling the use of tobacco among the youths, citizens and hence mitigating the number of preventable deaths occurring in the district every year. SRKPS has taken strong steps to make sure, through meetings with public transport in charge, media persons, NGOs, gram Panchayats and educational institute, that the people are aware of the prevailing laws and guidelines and follow the COTPA act 2003 against tobacco consumption. Media workshop, Signature Campaign, formation of DTC (District tobacco control committee, including 25 NGO, line department officials, teachers, social activists), are the various action based activities carried out under Tobacco Control Program in Jhunjhunu. Constant liasoning with government officials, DC, Pradhan, Chairman (Municipal Corporation), formulation of district task force, formulation of district and block level tobacco cell, ensuring usage of Challan against the tobacco users etc were maintained to make this District tobacco free. With all these consistent efforts Line department and administration has become active, as strong actions are now been taken, for eg, Promotion and Display of IEC materials at public places, offices, schools etc, Thus on the Eve of World Anti Tobacco day, on 31st may 2012 in front of more than 2000 intellectuals Jhunjhunu Collector Sri Jogaram Ji announced Jhunjhunu district to a Tobacco Free District. A book on Tobacco free District was inaugurated as well as participants signed the signature campaign as a mark of support to anti tobacco campaign.

In coming years we will be at pains to keep Jhunjhunu District a tobacco free district based on international standards.

National Tobacco Control Program

The tobacco control cell under the supervision of chief medical & health officer Jhunjhunu initiated the implementation of the National tobacco control program- in secondary or senior secondary school of Jhunjhunu district. The program or campaign is preliminary aimed to create tobacco free school. The project aims to create tobacco free institutions by strengthening and expanding tobacco control initiatives in Jhunjhunu. Under these project different activities like awareness campaign & prize distribution among students, conducted at 15 Institution in Jhunjhunu, and these schools were declared tobacco free schools as per CBSE guidelines.

Natural resource management:

Rajasthan is the driest state having only 1.16 percent of country's surface water. Average rainfall is 531 mm against national average of 1200 mm. 2/3 part of the state is desert where average rainfall is only 380 mm. Out of 237 development blocks in the state, only 32 blocks are considered safe. In absence of surface water, reliance on ground water is excessive as such water table is depleting at alarming rate in most of the area except in canal command area.

Thus, the problems that emerged from groundwater use were not limited to depleting sources, but also contaminants that did not need to be dealt with before. As of now, the scenario is fearful and alarming. There are a variety of problems that relate to quantity as well as quality. Eighty per cent of our drinking water needs are met by groundwater, which is depleting at an alarming rate, compounded with large scale contamination.

SRKPS for the last 24 years is creating awareness among the community for proper utilization and preservation of the resources. Watershed development, Introduction of short duration plants, plants suitable for arid and semi arid regions, large scale plantation in farm and hill sides, Construction of Rain water harvesting storage devices and recharge well, catchments correction, renovation of existing storage devices, orchard development, training programs for farmers and PRIs on IWRM, etc are the various action based activities that are being carried out by SRKPS in the intervention areas.

Project 1: War for Water

Winning Augmentation and Renovation (WAR) for Water project is being implemented by SRKPS in 5 villages of Bheenchi Cluster, Ratangarh Block of Churu District. This project, being initiated from 19th July 2011, is supported by Department of Science and Technology (DST), Consultancy Development Center (CDC), Water and Power Consultancy Services (WAPCOS).

In the above mentioned cluster, the Fluoride and TDS content in water is high in comparison to standard value as compared to fixed standard of W.H.O, India and Rajasthan State. Health status

of the community residing in these areas has been badly affected due to the consumption of poor quality of water and the common diseases are fluorosis, bone problems, dental problems etc.

Under this project it was aimed to develop a self sustainable and self operated accessible rain water management system by constructing 275 rain water harvesting structure tanks (KUND) in the cluster area, for the identified beneficiaries giving preference to weaker section and BPL in Bheenchri, Budhwali, Seetsar, Mainasar and Khotdi villages of Bheenchri Cluster of Churu District. A total of 275 Household Kunds of capacity of 20,000 liters each is been constructed in the cluster consisting of 5 villages, thus building a water bank of 55 lakh liters.

Providing affordable and sustainable solution to store seasonally available water through an inexpensive method of Rainwater harvesting methodology, harnessing and managing the monsoon rain water, Skill up gradation of the people and formulation of Village Water and Sanitation Committee for monitoring, operation and maintenance of the entire setup, were the strategies taken in this project



Major Achievements of the Project:

1. Access to safe water as 55 lakh liters of water supply ensured , storage devices built within their premises
2. Availability of safe water within their premises , sustainable solution for next 20 years
3. Enhancement of awareness and responsibility among community in storage and usage of water
4. Since the water samples of RWHT tested have been found portable and fit for human consumption, lot of improvement in overall health of the community were observed
5. Average Rs 10 thousand/ per household/per year was spent in buying water , that much money is being saved and it is being used for meeting out other basic needs such as education, health etc





Health

Better health is central to human happiness and well-being. It also makes an important contribution to economic progress, as healthy populations live longer, are more productive, and save more. Better health helps in attainment of personal ambition, favors personal efficiency, contributes to an individual's lifespan and has much to do with happiness and success as it permits people to conserve their earnings.

Breaking the vicious circle of poverty and ill health is an essential condition for economic development. Out of the eight MDG goals, five lay emphasis on gender and health and hence one can realize how important it is for the development of the society. The present pattern of development has been directly affecting the lives of the poor and marginalized, as access to accessible and affordable health services has been a challenge for the rural masses.

Improving quality and accessibility of existing government health services through strengthening the capacities of the service providers and strengthening the accountability and responsibility of the mechanisms, is the aim with which SRKPS is functioning in the health sector.

- **SAMVEDNA**

To demonstrate a NGO managed model sub center “Aapno Swasthya Kendra (ASK)” as per the IPH standard with emphasis on safe motherhood, SRKPS operated a model Sub-center at Dhandhuri village in Jhunjhunu District of Rajasthan. In year 2003 ASK centre was first established in Luna village of Alsisar panchayat Samiti of Jhunjhunu District which later shifted to Dhandhuri Village in year 2008. This project is supported by ARTH, Udaipur, PFI (Population Foundation of India), New Delhi. The main objective is to provide quality maternal health services by skilled nurse midwives in the targeted villages. Through this centre, Health and safe motherhood services were provided to 25 thousand community members of 23 villages. Financial support from PFI was discontinued from 2010, but organization operated the ASK center till September 2013 through its own resources.



In last one year from Aril 2012- Sep 2012 ASK carried out 136 safe deliveries and provided 112 JSY cheque including Birth certificate to the child, all together referral cases was 06 and 1796 patients were treated at OPD.

Change

SRKPS in collaboration with CHETNA (Ahmedabad) have undertaken a project (Participatory Communication Initiative For Improving Access To Public Healthcare Services For Rural Communities In India under **The National Rural Health Mission**) during the period of April 2010 – December 2012. **The overall goal of the project is to ensure selected communities in the Churu Block have access to quality public health services through the process of Community Mobilization with the help of participatory communication techniques under the National Rural Health Mission of the Government of India.**

Since April 2010 to December 2012, SRKPS implemented the CHANGE Project in Churu block of Churu district. The CHETNA-CHANGE project has been implemented in 107 villages of 35 Gram Panchayat of Churu block of Churu district in coordination with Block and District Health Department. It focuses on ensuring sustainability of the communication mechanism and strengthening the Village Health and sanitation committee, with an overall objective of mobilizing “Gram Swasthya Baithak”(GSB).

158 community meetings, 116 forum meetings, training program for ASHAs and VHSC members, participation on MCHN days and panchayat meetings, interaction with PRI members, and advocacy on the health issues were conducted persistently to bring out a change in the perspective of the community where they take ownership and demand for their health rights especially on MCH entitlements. GSB were conducted in these villages where participation from all section of societies including the deprived and marginalized was ensured and their grievances were addressed.

The major changes observed at the field level are:

1. Enhanced the confidence of the Health service providers.
2. A systematic process of communicating was facilitated and followed.
3. Trainings, followed by refresher training and involvement of health department officials developed a concerned unit working on advancement of health indicators.
4. Issues related to Mother and child health, nutrition, were discussed and addressed.
5. Better coordination and behavioral changes among the PRI and accessibility of health services to the community.

MAMP:



SRKPS made an agreement with Mamta (Health Institute for Mother & Child), New Delhi with the financial support from Green Ply New Delhi, on 1st November 2010 to implement the project Mera Abhiyan Meri Pehchan in 67 villages of Laxmangarh block of Sikar district with an overall goal Creating enabling environment for adolescent reproductive and sexual health and rights through integrated health and development initiatives with special focus on prevention of early marriage and early pregnancy.

Under the project we aim to create a supportive environment in the community for right age at marriage and pregnancy through community mobilization, to empower adolescent through peer education, life skill and livelihood opportunities and to strengthen health system for the adolescent friendly health services. In the financial year (2012-13) the project team prevented twenty early marriages, delayed the age of Gauna of thirty five married adolescents, eighty five couple has been identified and has been provided counseling on usage of contraceptives, delay of child birth, maternal and child health issues with the help of auxiliary nurse midwife, 53 drop out was linked with school retention program and 256 adolescents were linked with AWC and mobilized for hemoglobin test in all the 67 respective villages of Laxmangarh block.

Under this project we aim to create a supportive environment in the community for right age at marriage and pregnancy through community mobilization, to empower adolescents through peer education, life skills and livelihoods opportunities and to strengthen the existing health system for the Adolescent Friendly health Service. Complete data profile of all the youths, formulation of adolescent and parents group, mass awareness and information drives to create sensitization over the issues of adolescent health, early marriage and early pregnancy, setting of Infotainment and Adolescent Friendly Health Services centers are the activities conducted under this project.

SOW

SRKPS along with the support of Smile Foundation, New Delhi is running a mobile healthcare van in Jaipur with an objective of providing a comprehensive range of health care services to under-privileged community in outreach, remote rural areas and slums through an equipped mobile medical van. The project focuses on providing wide range of promotive, preventive and curative health services to the beneficiaries. The programme is based on the innovative concept of “Community based self sustainable health delivery model.” SOW was launched on 21st of August 2010 at the community level and till now SRKPS has interacted with more than 1, 12,000 people from the slum communities and provided services to 25,000 people at their door steps. Smile Foundation has been working on the idea of getting curative measure to the marginalized people and also facilitating them on the health care services. It has made remarkable approaches to the slum areas and it getting widen up on the work. The team efforts and with the collaboration of Smile Foundation and SRKPS, it has spread in many outreach areas. It has not



only given the awareness to the people but also motivated them to put first step forward for achieving the health success.

It is hoped that the SOW project will be able to provide health services to all the needy of the intervention area at reasonable costs so that they too can have access to quality services at affordable rates.

TI KOTA

With the financial support of RSACS (Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society), Jaipur, a TI project, with a target of 300 IDUs (Injecting Drug Users), is being implemented in Kota District of Rajasthan, started from March 2011.

As part of targeted interventions, SRKPS focuses on all the seven components of IDU TI:

- Condom promotion
- Management of STI
- Enabling environment
- Behavioural Communication change
- Community Mobilization
- Referral and Linkages
- Needle syringe exchange program

The TI (Targeted Intervention) project is being run on the objectives of NACP III. As per target was 300 IDUs and the organization currently 317 were identified IDUs where 2 IDUs are positive. All the IDUs are getting TI services as per requirement. We have formed crisis committee to provide technical as well as financial support to IDU in crisis situation such as being harassed by police, community etc. IDUs are coming to DIC for getting services recreational activity, playing etc on the regular basis. Advocacy from different stakeholders is on regular basis. For the engagement of the community we organized community event, health camp program on 2 times in a year. In the community event quiz competition was held in which the AIDs awareness question was asked and winners were appreciated and prize were distributed. Conducting BCC (Behavior Communication Change) meeting, cultural activities, promotion of condom use, drop in centre activities, counseling in NGO clinic by counselors, Meeting with PLWA (People Living with HIV/AIDS) etc. are the action based activities conducted in this project. The project expects to sensitize people and the IDUs about the harms of injecting drugs and it's relating to HIV/AIDS so that even when they are taking drugs, they should be careful regarding the communication of diseases and practice safe ways to curb the spread of HIV/AIDS. Now organization is focusing on the OST (opioid substitution therapy) to change their injecting behavior from injecting practice to oral consumption. Observing the overall performance of TI-KOTA Project, it has been considered to make it a learning site for



other organizations to observe and learn, so subsequently this year learning site assessment was done with the external agencies.

LOCAL SELF GOVERNANCE

The three tier structure of governance in India has helped in decentralization of powers to the citizens and the 73rd and the 74th Constitutional Amendment are the steps towards empowering the poor and marginalized, creating awareness and self reliant society. The Constitution provides ample space for all to participate equally be it men or women, STs and SCs in the process of governance so that justice and equality can prevail. Since 1995 SRKPS is developing a culture of good governance and accountability through involving CSOs, women, SC ST Representative and PRIs and building their capacity. Reservation in the last two decades has brought a lot of political and social changes at panchayat and municipal level. Women, SC and ST Representatives have come up with their grievances and are successfully executing their rights and duties.

Empowerment of elected representatives:

SRKPS is implementing Empowerment campaign through capacity building workshops with women, SC and ST representatives of 2 gram Panchayats of Jaisalmer. Through capacity building programs Sarpanch and ward panch are bring oriented on their rights and duties. Support is being provided to PRI to work similarly to other progressive gram Panchayats of the State by providing information as well as through Exposure visits. They are also motivated to monitor the quality of education and health services being provided at the village level.

Strengthening Gender Responses of Panchayats in Rajasthan, Project

SRKPS along with the technical support of PRIA, New Delhi and financial support from UNFPA is implementing a project entitled 'Strengthening Gender Response of Panchayats in Rajasthan'. In this project sensitization and capacity building programmes is being carried out for VHSC, PRIs and Standing committee on Social justice members, 22 villages of 5 gram panchayat of Alsisar block, Jhunjhunu District. This project has been initiated to sensitize people, especially the PRIs to give the women their rights and freedom that they deserve, and



mobilizing them to prepare their health plan with their participation of community especially deprived, socially backward and vulnerable group.

RIGHT TO INFORMATION

SRKPS is actively working in Sikar, Churu, Hanumangarh, Ganganagar, Jaisalmer, Udaipur and Jhunjhunu on the mobilizing and building capacity of local NGOs and media on RTI act. 75 NGOs and 55 media personnel has been oriented on the issue of the RTI act. As a result different CBO, social activist, have filed 5302 RTI and asked information under on various issues. By publishing the information and data received through RTI, Media too is providing its support in creating awareness and sensitization among the community.

FAMILY COUNSELING CENTER

Organization is dedicated towards the development of common masses, this development cannot be achieved until we protect the right of people, so towards the same, organization is running a Family Counseling Center (FCC). The FCC aims at resolving, tackling and providing counseling to women who are disturbed by problems within their family situation. In the last year 252 cases of dowry related cases, family problems, domestic violence etc were addressed through FCC.

RIGHT TO EDUCATION

After launch of Right to Education it is mandatory that every girl and boy of marginalized section goes to school. Under RTE SRKPS did advocacy with the private schools and mobilized them to provide support for bringing and adding the deprived children to their school. Under these 371 children from 15 villages were of deprived section has been enrolled into government and private schools.

RESEARCH

Study on Community Perspective on Dropouts Among Children in Laxmangarh Block of Sikar District of Rajasthan

With an objective of “To understanding the factors leading to dropout and understanding the community perspective towards dropout “ Research was conducted under the Mera Abhiyaan Meri Pehchaan project at Laxmangarh Sikar by interns from XISS, Ranchi. Total 200 samples and interviews with stakeholders including school dropout children, their parents, health service **Shikshit Rojgar Kendra Prabandhak Samiti, Jhunjhunu, (Raj)**



providers, teachers, community leaders, PRIs etc were conducted in the research. The main finding of the study is that youngsters do not drop out merely because they are losing interest towards education. Neither do they find education interesting nor do they think it's important for them. During the study, it has been found out that majority of the children dropped out of school before secondary education. The consequences for youngsters who drop-out before finishing secondary education is dramatic, in terms of high unemployment and low lifelong earnings.

STUDY ON TOBACCO TREATMENT PROTOCOL IMPLEMENTATION AT A MULTI-SPECIALITY HOSPITAL IN JAIPUR

Tobacco Treatment Protocol or TTP is a maiden attempt to be implemented in the State of Rajasthan (and probably in the country also) to improve the quit rate. It was launched in 9 January 2013. It is being implemented in S.K. Soni Hospital, Jaipur with the collaboration of Rajasthan Cancer Foundation, Jaipur. The study shows that the problem of tobacco dependence and the diseases it causes is nothing new and it has been one of the major causes of preventable deaths all over the world. Though there are various consultations provided by various doctors but in India there are no specific programs dedicated to tobacco cessation. The tobacco treatment protocol is a unique attempt to put a check to tobacco dependence and motivate and counsel the patients to stop using tobacco products by providing treatment. This paper is a modest attempt to explore the various aspects of this program and also understand the views of the different stakeholders associated with this program.

Compliance Assessment Survey of Section 6 (a), (b) of COTPA- 2003 and Tobacco Free educational institutions in Jhunjhunu district of Rajasthan

With the support of The Union A compliance study was conducted in Jhunjhunu District of Rajasthan. The objective of the study was that to measure the level of compliance to the section 6 (a) of COTPA by the tobacco vendors in District Jhunjhunu and to measure the level of compliance to the section 6 (b) of COTPA in educational institutions. For section 6 (a) compliance surveys, 400 tobacco vendors (18 Temporary /movable kiosk, 76 Permanent kiosk and 306 Permanent shops) were observed for compliance. For section 6 (b) and Tobacco free educational institution survey, total 407 educational institutions (298 Government institution and 109 Private institutions) sampled. The report indicates that there is less compliance in section 6(a), in comparison to section 6 (b). Awareness as well as strict implementation of the COTPA act need to be followed to ensure tobacco free district.
